

Pastor's Letter

December, 2010

"Prepare The Way of the Lord"

"My soul magnifies the Lord and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior, for he has been mindful of the humble state of his servant. From now on all generations will call me blessed, for the Mighty One has done great things for me - holy is his name. His mercy extends to those who fear him, from generation to generation..." Luke 1:46-56

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Every once in awhile, we will read a news report about a woman who wakes up in the middle of the night, or goes home from work in the middle of the day with terrible indigestion. As the pains increase and begin to come in noticeable intervals, she goes to her doctor and low and behold, the doctor determines the reason for her pain. She's pregnant. In fact, she's in labor. And before the day is over, she is a mother. Surprise!

One day, a young woman, probably in her teens, was surprised by the announcement that she was pregnant. Surprised because she had never been intimate with a man. Surprised because the announcement was made to her by an angel of the Lord. Surprised because the angel described this child in such incredible terms. "He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High," the angel said. (Luke 1:32-33).

As we might expect, all this young woman could say was, "How could this be?" How could this be that I should be pregnant. How could this be that I should be chosen to be the mother of God. How could this be happening to me?

Mary's words have been memorialized by the Church by setting them to music, "The "Magnificat." 'Magnificat' is Latin for "Magnify." We know what that means. It means to make large. When you look at things under a microscope it magnifies them so that what was hidden to the naked eye can be seen. When a detective is looking for clues to a crime he gets out his magnifying glass to examine for fingerprints and so forth. As Mary examines her situation, it is the child she is carrying who comes up big.

How easy it would have been for us to understand if Mary's soul had magnified Mary. For the Lord to have chosen her to carry the King of Kings and the Lord of Lord's - she must be pretty special. We'd understand if Mary had magnified Mary because we all have magnified ourselves under far less dramatic circumstances. When God blesses us in far less spectacular ways than with an immaculate conception, we survey the situation and usually conclude that God knew what He was doing in picking us to bless.

The example of Mary causes us to ask ourselves, who or what am I magnifying in my life right now? What' the biggest thing in my life right now? Am I magnifying the Lord, or myself or am I magnifying my problems? Often times we magnify our problems. This is not to say that the problems we each face, and we all face them, aren't real, serious and to be faced seriously. It is however a warning to us that we can magnify our problems to the point that they appear bigger than everything else, God included. And that leads to real despair if not idolatry.

The Lord is indeed mindful of our lowliness. And that leads us to a surprising thing that happens when we magnify the Lord in our life. As we magnify the Lord, we get smaller. That is, we are humbled. And as we are humbled the Lord magnifies us before His Father in heaven.

Jesus presents you and me to the Father and says, "Here is the one I was telling you about. He's the one whose sin I have carried to the cross. He is a saint. She's the one I was telling you had no hope whom I filled with the living hope of the resurrection of the dead. Here is the fellow whom I prayed to you for who was tortured with guilt until I removed it in his eating and drinking of my

body and blood. And here, here is the one I spoke to you about who drowned and was born again in the same baptismal water Father, that you glorified me in. These are my brothers and sisters and I have invited them to call you their Father."

Allow the Word of God to humble you this Advent season. Allow the same Word to magnify the Christ who has come, is coming and will come again to magnify you before His heavenly Father. It happens every Sunday in worship.


Time frame? Approximately 1 ½ to 2 hours. Hope to see you there!!!

Twelve Days of Christmas

What in the world do leaping lords, French hens, swimming swans, and especially the partridge who won't come out of the pear tree have to do with Christmas?

From 1558 until 1829, Roman Catholics in England were not permitted to practice their faith openly. Someone during that era wrote this carol as a catechism song for young Catholics. It has two levels of meaning: the surface meaning plus hidden meaning known only to members of their church. Each element in the carol had a code word for a religious reality which the children could remember.

- -- The partridge in a pear tree was Jesus Christ.
- --Two turtle doves were the Old and New Testaments.
- -- Three French hens stood for faith, hope and love.
- --The four calling birds were the four gospels of Matthew, Mark, Luke and John.
- --The five gold rings recalled the Torah or Law, the first five books of the Old Testament.
- --The six geese a-laying stood for the six days of creation.
- —Seven swans a-swimming represented the sevenfold gifts of the Holy Spirit—Prophesy, Serving, Teaching, Exhortation, Contribution, Leadership and Mercy.
- --The eight maids a-milking were the eight beatitudes.
- --Nine ladies dancing were the nine fruits of the Holy Spirit—Love, Joy, Peace, Patience, Kindness, Goodness, Faithfulness, Gentleness and Self Control.
- --The ten lords a-leaping were the Ten Commandments.
- --The eleven pipers piping stood for the eleven faithful disciples.
- -The twelve drummers drumming symbolized the twelve points of belief in the Apostles' Creed.
