Pastor's Letter

February, 2015

"Economics of the Gospel"

"Come, everyone who thirsts, come to the waters; and he who has no money, come, buy and eat! Come, buy wine and milk without money and without price." Isaiah 55:1

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

"There's no such thing as a free lunch," says the economist. Everything has a price. Everything costs something. But the prophet says, *"Come, everyone who thirsts, come to the waters; and he who has no money, come, buy and eat! Come, buy wine and milk without money and without price."* The prophet is obviously not an economist.

Or could it be that it does indeed have a price, but that someone else has already paid the price in full? The prophet also says, *"He was pierced for our transgressions; he was crushed for our iniquities; upon him was the chastisement that brought us peace, and with his wounds we are healed."* (Isaiah 53:5)

Or to put it another way, we have run up a huge bill and he has picked up the tab. And the tab cost Him all that he had, because there really is "no such thing as a free lunch."

The people ate the bread and the fish without price. A free lunch! But the hands that multiplied it out to them were deeply scared. We receive freely because He has paid the price.

We talk about "the gospel" as the *"free gift of God,"* which is what it is. As soon as you start attaching any cost to the gospel at all, even a penny on a trillion dollars, it's no longer 'gospel' because it's no long 'free.' It may be 'cheap,' but it's not 'free.' As soon as you add those little words, "all you have to do is...", the gospel immediately turns into law. And none can afford the price.

Jesus Christ has paid your bill for you because you never could. And it had to be paid. Because there is no such thing as a free lunch. But now, because of Him, *"the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord..."* (Romans 6:23).

The only appropriate response to a 'free gift' is to take it and say 'thank you.' It's rude to insist that we could never take such a precious gift as life and salvation for free. 'Please, we absolutely insist that we must pay you something for it.' 'I'll work for food.' 'I want to do my part.' 'I'm not the kind of person who takes hand-outs.'

No, the economic principle of the gospel is that you can only pay a debt once. And once it's paid you can't pay on it anymore. No one pays on a debt that has already been paid off. And your debt to God has been paid in full by the blood of God's Son, shed for you. 'Free' is 'free' because the price has been paid in full.

And if you will not receive it on those terms, then you cannot have it, for it can only be had by faith. 'Faith' simply receives the gift gratefully. Faith simply trusts that the gift of life is paid in full by the love of God for me. Everything that follows is thanks in praise of God.

THE BEATITUDES are one of the most familiar and beloved sections in the gospels and one of the most difficult to grasp. Together, we will explore the heights and the depths of what it means to be BLESSED. Ash Wednesday is February 18th.

The Importance of Attending Mid-Week Special Services:

Although Sunday has always been the principle day of worship, there are times throughout the course of the year that have historically been reserved for 'mid-week' worship. Mid-week Lenten services are the most established occasions for 'non-Sunday' worship.

We live in a time when 'our time' is very scheduled and the schedule leaves very little 'spare time.' When the church calls its people to come to church during the mid-week, it is usually an interruption in our regular schedule and routine. It is important to allow these important times to interrupt our daily routine.

When the call to set aside the time and rearrange our schedules and routine comes, it is a refreshing opportunity to be reminded of the presence of Jesus in the middle of our day to day life that we too often miss. It also presents the opportunity for the strengthening of the self-discipline that it takes in our busy lives, to set aside what can be set aside for the sake of hearing the Word, engaging in prayer and receiving the sacrament.

Board for Missions Meeting Minutes: 1/7/15

Pastor Nielsen commended the Board for its work in 2014. He noted the thoughtful management of Mission Funds distribution as well as the intentional ways that the Board has involved the congregation in the mission work that is happening.

A Summary of the Missions giving of the Congregation for 2014 was as follows:

New England District – LCMS - \$8,517 (5% of offerings)

Missions giving - \$17,027 (10% of offerings)

Social Ministry -----\$ 630.84

Hope Lutheran Church--- \$2,400

Seminary Students-----\$4,500

Mission Speaker Rev. Cundiff visit----\$ 406

Seminarian Greg Bauch visit----\$ 251

Garuna Foundation-----\$1,520

Mid-Maine Homless Shelter---\$4,040

Maine Children's Home--\$1,000

Lutheran Heritage Foundation--- \$1,140

LCMS--Global Missions--\$1,140

An analysis of the distribution of mission funds was discussed:

Social Ministry missions: \$5,670 - 33%

Ministry and Gospel missions: \$11,364 - 67%

Gospel missions local: \$2,400 - 21%

Gospel missions national: \$5,517 - 45%

Gospel missions global: \$3,800 - 33%

It was agreed that the Board was satisfied with this distribution of mission funds. There was no desire to establish goals or limits for various categories as needs may change over time.

Mid-Maine Homeless Shelter:

A new sign-up sheet for 2nd Saturday dinners for the MMHS was prepared and posted by Amanda.

Individuals are encouraged to form groups and commit to an open date to prepare a meal. The Board will reimburse expenses incurred.

The “Men’s Clothing Drive” for the MMHS is in process. Clothing is being collected in the Fellowship Hall and parishioners are encouraged to involve neighbors, friends, co-workers by inviting them to gather clothing. **Sorting, folding, boxing and delivery is scheduled for Saturday, February 14th**. A light breakfast will be served beginning at 8:00am. **The work begins at 9:00am**. It was discussed how to best organize the work. We will need as much help as possible as we expect a very positive response.

Brian will arrange a visit to the congregation by Betty Palmer, director of the MMHS. The preferred date is February 22nd.

Mission Sunday

“Mission Sunday” is set for March 22nd. Rev. Jeff Ehlers of the Garuna Foundation has committed to come. He will lead Adult Bible Study and preach at worship. The Board will have a dinner reception with him on the 21st at 6:00pm. There was discussion regarding congregation and individual involvement in the “Garuna Kids” program. The Board will be prepared to present Rev. Ehlers with a check for \$1,080 at his visit to renew our adoption of three Cambodian students. The Board committed to sponsor Fellowship after worship on the 22nd.

The February meeting of the Board is scheduled for Wednesday, February 4th – 6:30pm. All members of the congregation who may be interesting in serving on this Board are invited to attend.

Dear Co-Witnesses to the Gospel of Jesus Christ:


“Who can proclaim the mighty acts of the Lord or fully declare his praise? Blessed are those who act justly, who always do what is right.” (Psalm 106:2-3)


