Pastor's Letter

January, 2015 Epiphany

"This grace was given us in Christ Jesus before the beginning of time. And it has now been revealed through the appearing of our Savior, Christ Jesus, who has destroyed death and has brought life and immortality to light through the gospel" 1 Timothy 1:10

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Epiphany is sometimes called, "The Season of Light" from the star that guided the Magi to Bethlehem and that marks the Day of Epiphany. The focus throughout the season of Epiphany is on the Christ, who is 'the light of the world.'

According to the official record, it was night when God created the earth. In Genesis 1:2 we read, for "the earth was formless and empty, and <u>darkness</u> was over the surface of the deep." And while the Spirit of God was hovering over the waters, God said, "Let there be light; and there was light." (Gen.1:3).

Also according to the official record, it will be a dark night when this world comes to a close. In his parable, Jesus says, "At <u>midnight</u>, the cry rang out: 'Here's the bridegroom! Come out to meet him." (Matthew 25:6).

Between the first and the last night of the world is the One who is 'the light of the world." The Light of the world has come from heaven to earth in the flesh of the only-begotten Son of the Father. He was in the beginning, with God, when the darkness first gave way to the light.

He is the light that reveals. And we may ask, "what does He reveal?" And the answer is, "He reveals the heart of God and the love that is in that heart for all mankind." That is why Jesus is called, "The Word made flesh." How is it that even you and I reveal the thoughts and intentions of our heart for others? How do we express what we feel and what we desire? Isn't it through words – either spoken or written? Likewise, God reveals Himself to us through His Word – spoken through His Son, written through the inspiration of His Holy Spirit.

God forbid that it be said of us, "The light shines in the darkness, but the darkness has not understood it." Or, "He was in the world, and though the world was made through him, the world did not recognize him." Or, "He came to that which was his own but his own did not receive him." Even today He is not received, misunderstood and unknown by so many of those whom He has come to enlighten and bless. And we may ask, "Why does the world reject the Light?" And the answer is, "Because sin loves the darkness rather than the light." Because light reveals – not only the face of God in Christ but also the heart of man before God. Because we do not want to give up our sins and live in the light."

"Yet to all who received Him, to those who believed in his name, he gave the right to become children of God..." Wherever Christ shines in the heart there is light and life. Even when that light of truth uncovers many sins, it is a light of comforting grace and forgiveness. It is a light from the face of God that overcomes the fear of death through the resurrection of Christ from the dead. It is a light that brings life to the heart and soul of a believer and gives courage and strength to fight against and even overcome the works of darkness and to walk in the light of the truth. It is a light that enlightens us to become little lights in a dark world.

Seeking to Serve...notes from a Deaconess student

Dear Brothers and Sisters of LCR,

Four months have now passed since I began my distance Deaconess Studies at Concordia Theological Seminary. My second academic course focused on the Lutheran Confessions. I can now honestly state that I "subscribe to these Symbols", am very well acquainted with all parts of the Book of Concord, have worked thoroughly through them and much better understand the concepts of original sin, justification by faith alone, the nature of Christ, and "Real Presence."

Each week we had to write a reflection on the portion we had studied, responding to a particular question posed by our professor. I'm thankful for these writings assembled over four hundred years ago in the midst of various controversies of the European Christian churches. Such disagreements within the Christian community continue to persist among churches today. The documents included have clear grounding and references to the Bible, both Old and New Testament texts.

My other course which took place over the whole four months was Field Education, a class of practical matters addressing prayer, living a life of mercy, learning how to listen more intentionally, an introduction to topics of child abuse, struggles with barrenness, and pornography. Our class interacts via "Moodle", a kind of computer classroom. My instructor and fellow students, who live in states as far west as Iowa, and south to Alabama, comment on assigned readings with each other. We also have to occasionally submit reports about visits with parishioners (names changed) or topics for joint consideration and education and respond to those.

In about three weeks I will head out to Fort Wayne, Indiana for two weeks of intensive coursework. I will do some preparatory reading and writing for the classes before the on-campus time, and will be studying the Pauline Letters and Theological Ethics.

I continue to ask for your prayers and am thankful for them as well as financial support I have received.

Thank you from Seminarian Paul Rockrohr


Pastor Nielsen and Members of LCR,


