Dear Brothers and Sistrers in Christ,

"Well, you could have come to church any time you wanted," said Jean. "The door is open to all." "And I took you to Bunko Night last winter," said Alice. "You told me how much you enjoyed it." "Yes," said Sharon; "it was really fun. But I'm talking about more than that." "Then what are you talking about?"

"My husband and I decided we should join a church for the sake of the kids. I like you two, so I phoned your church. Your pastor invited Bill and me to come to the Inquirer's Class. We've been going on Tuesday nights." "That's wonderful," said Alice. "I thought the classes would be about history and what to do in the church service," said Sharon. "But they aren't. Every evening we study about Jesus Christ. I had heard about Him," said Sharon. "But the pastor says He is God who became a person like us. I knew He had died, but i didn't know why. The pastor says it's because He loves us and offered Himself as a sacrifice to pay for our sins. Your pastor says Jesus has taken away all our guilt Do you believe that?"

"Of course I do," said Alice. "And you?" "Sure," said Jean. "That's what it's all about." "Then why didn't you ever tell me? I mean, why didn't you tell me *why* you go to church. Look how long I've known you two. I've told you both about some pretty serious problems in my life. You know I carry guilt around in a bucket. Why did I have to go to a class to discover the place to dump it?" "You're putting guilt in our buckets now," said Jean.

"But I want to talk to you about Jesus," said Sharon. "He forgives you too. Isn't that great!" "Yes, it is," said Jean. "I've known that all my life. Maybe sometimes I take it for granted. I thought everyone knew that He's the Savior of the world." "I never knew it," said Sharon. "I'm glad you know it now," said Alice. "I wish I had been the one who told you." "In one way you did," said Sharon. "I'm not angry with you. I phoned the church you two belong to, because I like the way you live. I thought you had something special, and I wanted to have it *too.*"

Mortgage Principle Status

The building addition was completed in 2000. The monthly payment on the mortgage loan through Lutheran Church Extension Fund is \$1,108.66. In January of 2010, the Church Council voted to authorize the treasurer to add \$400 per month to the monthly payment to go directly towards the principle. The 2011 budget increased that amount to \$600 per month. Additionally, members have been designating special gifts to 'principle reduction.' The mortgage principle balance is as follows:

- January 1, 2009 \$119,168
- January 1, 2010 \$110,439
- June 1, 2010 \$102,573
- June 1, 2011 \$79,430

A Summer Reading Challenge - Read through your Small Catechism this summer!

"It is quite true that wherever the preacher administers only bread and wine for the Sacrament, he is not very concerned about to whom he gives it, what they know or believe, or what they receive. There one sow feeds with the others, and such preachers simply see themselves above such caring. They would rather have uninstructed, ecstatic saints than have the care of nurturing Christians. Rather, they want to do things in such a way that after three years every thing would be laid waste, and neither God nor Christ nor Sacrament nor Christians would remain anymore. However, because we are concerned about nurturing Christians who will still be here after we are gone, and because it is Christ's body and blood that are given out in the Sacrament, we will not and cannot give such a Sacrament to anyone unless he is first examined regarding what he has learned from the Catechism and whether he intends to forsake the sins which he has again committed. For we do not want to make Christ's church into a pig pen [Matthew 7:6], letting each one come unexamined to the Sacrament as a pig to its trough. Such a church we leave to the Enthusiasts!"

"And all of this we have received from the beginning of Christendom. For there we see and grasp the way in which the Creed, the Our Father, and the Ten Commandments were put together as a short summary and doctrine for the young and for those in need of instruction. From early on this was what was called a "catechism." For "catechism" (say the Greeks) is a way of teaching with questions and answers, just as a schoolmaster has his pupils recite their lesson to see if they know it or not. In this way, those in need of instruction are to be examined and by their answers show that they know the parts of the Catechism, that they recognize the sin they again have done, and are willing to learn more and desire to do better. If they will not do this, they may not come to the Sacrament. The pastor is there as Christ's faithful servant, and as far as it is possible for him, he may never cast the Sacrament to swine or dogs [Matthew 7:6]. He is to hear the people out and how it is with them. If they deceive him and do not speak honestly, then he is exonerated. They have done the deceit upon themselves." Martin Luther – 1533.


