Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As in every good marriage, we have been though plenty of ups and downs and joys and sorrows together. And through them all, we have grown and learned to bless the Lord in every situation.

There were those times when we weren't sure if we were going to make it, and those times when we have been so excited for the future. There's been lots of hard work and sacrifice together, and in looking back, it does seem as though the harder the work and the greater the sacrifices that we made together, the greater the joy and fellowship and downright fun we have had together.

The size of our family of faith has grown over the years and that has been a great joy. We've seen the building and parking lot and church organ grow and that has been very exciting. But we have also seen many members leave us and that always causes a deep sadness.

I am beginning to enjoy some of the benefits of a 'long-term pastorate,' as I have the privilege of confirming some whom I have baptized. But along with those joys comes also the sorrows of burying some who were dear friends.

As with every marriage, there have been ups and downs in our relationship. But we have learned to say "I'm sorry," and also to say "I forgive you," because the love of Christ compels us to do so. As strange this may sound, I think that it is in our confessing to one another and our forgiving one another that our love for one another grows deeper and richer. What else can this be but Jesus Christ at work among us.

At first I wasn't too sure, but now I am so glad that the Lord called me to come here. I want to thank those who were here when I and my family arrived and who welcomed us with their gracious support and who are still here today: Chris and Yvonne, Brendan and Corina Batson; Doris Brossy; Natalie Crowley; Peter and Lois Doran; Peter and Evelyn Gaug; Avis (Krause) Grant; Twila Kaska; Sharon Klipp; Mark and Lee Anne Larsen; Bonnie Matthieu; Don and Marlene Pryor; Herb Schartner; and Jim, Darryll, Kenneth Zahner. There were others as well who have either died or moved away. Everyone who is here today, owes a great deal to their willingness and devotion to preserve a troubled congregation in the hopes that the Lord might not be done with it quite yet.

I recall my initial conviction that the life and health of any congregation, this one particularly, would depend on two things; faithful attendance in worship and faithful attendance in bible study. Everything else would fall into place in proportion to these two essentials. That remains my

conviction still. The Holy Spirit works through His Word preached and His Sacraments administered in the Divine Service. Growth in faith comes by hearing the Word and the diligent study of the Scriptures. After that, everything else will fall into place just fine. So my fervent plea to everyone today is the same as it has been for the last 20 years: <u>set Sunday aside for the Lord</u>. Be in worship <u>AND</u> bible study; not only for your own sake, but for the sake of the whole congregation.

The future, as always, in the hands of our gracious Lord. I do hope however, that there is both the opportunity and the willingness for much more hard work and sacrifice ahead. Twenty years of joy and good fellowship and downright fun is not enough. I'd like more. I know that there are many whom the Lord has yet to call out of the darkness and into His light that shines here. I'd like the joy of meeting and welcoming them into this wonderful family.

#### **Board for Missions:**



Board For Missions Meeting Minutes - June 12, 2013

Attendance: Pastor Nielsen, Amanda Goldsmith, Andrea Watson, Michelle Hein, Avis Grant & Dan Callahan.

Pastor Nielsen opened the meeting in prayer and led us in devotions, Faith Active in Love, Human Care in the Church's Life. Review of the BFM May minutes by Michelle.

Amanda conveyed that future BFM agenda's will be curtailed from the length they have been. Giving focus to current projects, projects for consideration and distribution of funds.

#### Current Projects:

- Hope Lutheran Church, Bangor, ME. Discussion was opened by Pastor Nielsen of what more LCR could do in helping HLC, beyond financial assistance. Dan suggested updates from Pastor Evertsen regarding HLC's needs and standing. Pastor Nielsen said he would reach out to Pastor Evertsen on receiving updates. Avis suggested inviting the HLC congregation to LCR events and/or having joint events. It was further suggested groups from LCR visit HLC.
- **Mid-Maine Homeless Shelter**. Betty Palmer, from the MMHS conveyed to Amanda that volunteer's are needed to assist their residence with various daily life guidance to help them in preparation for work, with family, parenting and basic life skills. Amanda and Michelle agreed to prepare a brief presentation to bring to the congregation at an upcoming fellowship for this need and with signing up for meal preparation.
- Home for Little Wanders. Andrea notified the organization of LCR's \$2,000 donation for sending children to summer camp. She reported they were very happy with LCR's donation. Leeann Larson approached Amanda regarding the Homes waiting area for counseling

services. The waiting room is in need of several repairs, furniture and toys in working condition. Once the board knows what they specifically need for the waiting area it was agreed an effort to make repairs and donations would be addressed. Avis suggested the children of the church be asked to donate used toys and Michelle suggested a special message during the children's sermon about giving and being charitable, that would coincide with this request.

**<u>Current Budget</u>**: The current funds amount reported to the board was \$2,200. However, there may have been a possible discrepancy in the amount reportedly donated in May. Sharon's email showed May's donations totaling \$4,000. The actual amount was \$5,000. Amanda said she would connect with Sharon to confirm if the current funds of \$2,200 were reflective of a \$4,000 or \$5,000 May donations. Dan suggested the board hold the funds currently available should any urgent needs arise and make a determination of donations for July. The board unanimously agreed.

#### **Project for Considerations**:

- Seminary Student Support. The board agreed to recommend that we continue supporting 2 seminary students at the Fort Wayne Seminary at \$250 each per month beginning with September, 2013. We will ask the Seminary to assign two new students to us since both Jonathan Williams (graduated) and Paul Rockrohr (vicarage) will not be at the Seminary this year.
- **First Choice Pregnancy Center**: Pastor Nielsen asked that the board consider making this organization an ongoing project to support. The organization will be moving to a new location on KMD in Waterville once renovations are completed. The board agreed to asking a representative from First Choice to make a presentation at the July meeting. Michelle offered to make the arrangements.

#### **Missions Giving Form:**

Amanda offered to rework the previously developed form with changes already suggested. The form will be presented for further discussion at the July meeting.

<u>A fall, "Missions Weekend"</u> was discussed. Ideas included having a Saturday evening dinner at the church and inviting the Hope Lutheran Church congregation to join us. Involvement from organizations LCR has made financial and time donations to would be given time to make presentations on what they do with funds and what their upcoming needs may be. Pastor Nielsen suggested the church invite Pastor Cundiff and his wife to participate in this weekend, sharing their experience in Kenya. The board agreed further discussions this subject should be discussed at upcoming meetings.

#### 2013 LCMS Convention: The National Offering

The Church Council approved a \$1,000 offering for The National Offering that will be taken at the Synodical Convention in July. The National Offering embodies our walk Together as a Synod in Witness, Mercy, and Life Together as we proclaim the Gospel and provide for our brothers and sisters in Chris in our congregations, communities and world.

#### Mortgage Principle Status

The building addition was completed in 2000. The monthly payment on the mortgage loan through Lutheran Church Extension Fund is \$1,108.66. In January of 2010, the Church Council voted to authorize the treasurer to add \$600 per month to the monthly payment to go directly towards the principle. The 2011 budget increased that to \$800 per month. The 2012 budget increased that to \$1,000 per month which was continued into the 2013 budget. Additional designated gifts for 'principle reduction' have been applied. The mortgage principle balance is as follows:

- January 1, 2009 \$119,168
- January 1, 2010 \$110,439
- June 1, 2010 \$102,573
- June 1, 2011 \$79,430
- June 1, 2012 \$49,879
- June 1, 2013 \$20,289


