#### Pastor's Letter May, 2012 "The Anniversary of the Titanic"



Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

There were a number of efforts launched last month 'celebrate' the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the tragedy of the 'Titanic.' The television and local movie theaters aired the movie. Replica dinners were served at area restaurants. A replica ship set sail on a commemorative voyage retracing the route of the original one. It struck me, as it may have you too, that there was something weird about the whole idea of replicating such a terrible disaster.

The "Titanic" was the pinnacle of human achievement for its time. It was the largest moving object ever to be built, let alone float on water. It was 'unsinkable.' Its builders clearly wanted to make a name for themselves. The ship set sail with only 20 lifeboats for the 2,223 passengers onboard. After all, what would an unsinkable ship need with lifeboats?

We all know how the story goes. It struck an iceberg off the coast of Newfoundland and sank within three hours. Only 650 people survived. 1573 of the passengers died in the icy waters of the Atlantic. What is most tragic however is that the 20 lifeboats had the capacity to hold 1,178 passengers, almost twice as many as the 650 who got into them. Maybe the greatest tragedy however was that so many more people could have been saved if only they had gotten into a lifeboat.

Every day we live with a tragedy even greater than the "Titanic" because so many people perish while the lifeboat of God's grace in Jesus Christ is right there.

Noah's ark was surely the biggest thing that anyone had ever built in that day. Noah must have taken a lot of ridicule from others while he was building the ark. Undoubtedly everyone who watched him build this incredible ship on dry ground with no water in sight asked Noah why he was doing such a strange thing.

What a tremendous opportunity Noah had to warn of the coming judgment of God upon the sin of the world. He would surely have told people about God's threat, "to wipe mankind...from the face of the earth..." He would have told them that God had seen how great man's wickedness had become, and "that every inclination of the thoughts of his heart was only evil all the time." (Gen.6:5,7). Certainly he would have asked them to repent and come onboard with he and his family.

But in the end, everyone who passed by Noah ignored his warning and said to themselves, "Ah, that could never happen." And they all perished when God immersed the world in water. What a terrible tragedy.

According to the movie, of the 20 lifeboats that made it off of the ship before it sank, only one returned looking for survivors. That may be a good way to think about our mission – "To Open Hearts: Through the Message of Christ Crucified." We have been brought into the lifeboat by the grace of God through Holy Baptism. In love for our neighbor, we go into the world and reach out to those drowning in sin and despair with the lifesaving message of the gospel. We dare not worry about the lifeboat becoming too crowded. We are not interested in replicating the great disaster of the 'Titanic.' Rather, we are interested in replicating the great rescue and deliverance of the Resurrection.

#### Thank You – from Seminarian Paul Rockrohr

Pastor Nielsen and members of LCR,

Greetings from Fort Wayne! I'm afraid that I'm behind in greeting and thanking you for all of your support, but it is not for lack of gratitude. As 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter ended at the beginning of March, I had high hopes to write you sooner, but as with the best laid plans of mice and men life continued to march to its own drum, and a good one at that! I had two weeks off that was spent with both sides of the family, and it was very refreshing albeit completely unproductive. It is not often that I have thanked God for a boring time, but it was exactly what the doctor ordered in this case.

So being refreshed I started this 3<sup>rd</sup> and final quarter of my first year of seminary. These last two weeks have been full of classes that challenge me to push myself, but they also lead to much reflection on this past year so far. When I first came into seminary I really didn't know what to expect, but after a few weeks I found that professors pushed us in many different ways on the road toward the pastoral ministry. These included giving us way too much work so that it would be impossible to complete everything, but it taught me that sometimes you have to realize what is more important to complete in a given time frame. They have also constantly challenged me to understand Scripture not simply as God's Word written down for us, but as something that is as much living and breathing as you or I. A strange thing to think of it as a living thing, but through it the Holy Spirit works and creates life in us where once was nothing but a dead stone heart.

It truly is proper to reflect in this time, this Lenten season. Some give up something for Lent, perhaps chocolate or something else. The hard thing to give up is time though, when only so many hours are there to accomplish so much. Lately I have considered my own use of time, that precious commodity that professors seem to covet from me. It is not always efficient or used well, but is a blessing given from God. And as time ticked on I found that my chances of Navy training this summer dwindled, but several other uses of my time have appeared. As of now I will most likely be going to South Sudan for about two weeks in August with a professor. It is very exciting for me to think about, but also ironic that I might be on the same continent as my parents but be nowhere near them.

But as one opportunity leaves and another comes along, God's presence in my life never leaves. The most obvious to me is still how many support me through prayers and gifts as this journey through seminary continues. You have been the merciful hand of God to me on more than one occasion, and I pray that this Lenten season you also have the living, breathing Scriptures at work in your life as they are in mine. May your time be filled with all the good gifts of our Lord who endured time as "God with us."
