Pastor's Letter October 2015

"I have learned to be content whatever the circumstances. I know what it is to be in need and I know what it is to have plenty. I have learned the secret of contentment in any and every situation, whether will fed or hungry, whether living in plenty or want. (Philippians 4:11-13).

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

There was once a farmer who grew tired of living on the same farm all his life. He imagined that there had to be better farms somewhere else. So he listed the farm with a realtor who immediately began to write the ad for the newspaper. Before he submitted the ad, he showed it to the farmer. The ad spoke of its excellent location, excellent equipment, fertile acres and well-bred livestock. "Wait a minute," said the farmer. "I've changed my mind. All my life I've been looking for a place just like that."

How much of our lives do we spend searching for that which we believe will satisfy us only to discover that we have had it all along? Phillip, one of the disciples of Jesus said to Him, "Lord, show us the Father and then we will be satisfied." And Jesus replies with deep disappointment saying, "Phillip don't you know that as long as I have been with you, you have been seeing the Father."

The big stumbling block that stands between us and contentment is that little word, 'if'. "If only" I had this or didn't have that or had more of this or less of that. "If only" I had a different job, a different house, a different spouse, a different body... "I have learned to be content whatever the circumstances."

We need to understand that Paul writes this letter from prison. His circumstances couldn't be much worse and yet he says that he's content. He has experienced nakedness, famine, danger and the sword. He has also experienced plenty; plenty of money, nice accommodations, and he has been content with that too.

We may laugh and say, who couldn't be content with plenty. After all that's just the circumstance that I'm trying arrange for myself. But Paul warns that 'plenty' is not the basis for contentment either. "People who want to get rich fall into temptation and a trap and into many foolish and harmful desires that plunge men into ruin and destruction. For the love of money is a root of all kinds of evil... But godliness with contentment is great gain. For we brought nothing into this world and we can take nothing out of it." (1Tim.6:8-10,6).

Contentment does not depend upon our circumstances. Our God has taken control of all of our circumstances and "for those who love God, all things work for good…" "He who did not spare His own Son, but gave Him up FOR US ALL, how will He not also with Him, graciously give us all things?" (Romans 8:28,32).

Contentment depends on our faith in the promise of God. Do we believe that He is in control and knows how to take care of us? Do we believe that through our circumstances the Lord is giving us the opportunity to bear witness to the world of peace and contentment that faith in Jesus Christ effects in a person?

What are the circumstances of your life right now? Are you waiting until they change before you can be content? Trusting in the Lord, we commend our bodies and souls and all things to Him and discover the 'secret of contentment' now.

Seeking to Serve...notes from a Deaconess student

Dear Brothers and Sisters of LCR,

During the summer, I attended intensive courses for two weeks at Concordia Theological Seminary in Fort Wayne. My two full courses there were "Theology of Mercy and Diakonal Care" and "The Gospel of Matthew." We also had a seminar on international missions and a workshop about "Revitalization" (ways for congregations to reach out to their communities more effectively) during the middle weekend.

This fall I am taking "The Gospel of Luke," and already am into my fifth of its eight weeks. At the same time I am also in a Field Practicum course exploring some Bible study materials, and continuing my participation in various aspects of our church life together. A few of you had a window into the way my classes take place during Sunday School on September 20.

Since the men's retreat focused on the Sacraments, I'll finish with a bit I wrote for my "Theology of Mercy" class regarding the same topic.

"The place where fellowship and forgiveness come together for us as family is in our celebration of the Lord's Supper. This feast of which we partake is a both a participation in and an anticipation of the heavenly feast to come. We most clearly perceive our connection to one another as a body and receive God's gifts which have joined and sustained us as this body when we gather for worship, whenever the church meets.

We receive God's gifts through *leitorgia*, Word and Sacraments (Baptism and the Lord's Supper), the pastor as instrument (the "vertical axis" of our connection to God) for our forgiveness and strengthening. As family or body we have fellowship, or *koinonia*, with one another as we together receive these gifts. *Diakonia* facilitates this "horizontal axis" as we serve one another, and "Consider how to stir up one another to love and good works, not neglecting to meet together...but encouraging one another" (Hebrews 10:24-25)."
