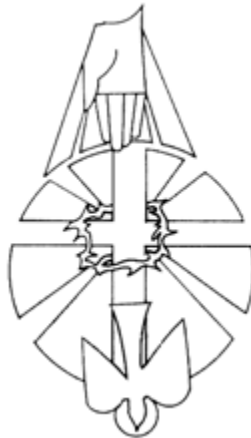
Welcome!




