

"Fight the good fight. Take hold of the eternal life to which you were called." 1 Timothy 6:12

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Are you one of those people who read the last chapter of a book before you read the beginning? Do you like to know how the story ends before you know how the story goes? When it comes to books and movies, most of us would probably say that we like to keep the end a mystery. It makes the story more interesting that way. And yet, the Christian is constantly reminded of the ending of his life's story, even while the story is in progress.

St. Paul reminds Timothy and us that it is important to be continually reminded of the ending of our story. "Take hold of the eternal life to which you were called." Be aware that your temporary life is headed towards eternal life.

If we believe our life's story ends in eternal life with our Lord in heaven, should we focus our attention on storing up earthly treasures or heavenly treasures? Listen to Jesus. "Do not store up for yourself treasures on earth where moth and rust destroy and where thieves break in and steal. But store up for yourselves treasures in heaven." (Matt.6:19). St. Paul says, "For we brought nothing into the world, and we can take nothing out of it." It was the custom in ancient Egypt, that when a Pharaoh died, certain possessions would be placed into the pyramid with him in order to help him in the life after. None of those things made it. They're all still there.

St. Paul says, "People who want to get rich fall into temptation and a trap and into many foolish and harmful desires that plunge them into ruin and destruction." Please understand, Paul is not telling us to get rid of everything we have and take a vow of poverty. Responsible stewardship is an important part of 'fighting the good fight of the faith.' Listen again to St. Paul. "But you, people of God, flee all this, and pursue godliness." "Godliness with contentment is great gain."

As Jesus journeyed to Galilee, he stopped in Samaria at a town called Sychar. There he met a woman who had come to the well to draw water. Jesus asked her for a drink of water because he was thirsty. He could see that this woman was not content with her life. He offered her a drink of living water. "Whoever drinks of the water that I shall give him will never thirst. The water that I give him will become in him a fountain of water springing up into everlasting life." (Jn.4:14).

'Fighting the good fight of faith' very often begins (and continues) with the fight against the temptation for more possessions and wealth. Real contentment is not based on our possessions, but on our possessing Christ and the knowledge that He has taken possession of us. He has told us the end of our story from the cross and until our day comes, we will be content with whatever we have as long as we have Christ. Take hold of the eternal life to which we have been called. It is the ending to the story of your life that Christ your Lord has written with His precious blood.
